NOTIFICATION OF DOCKET ENTRY

This docket entry was made by the Clerk on Friday, September 3, 2010:

MINUTE entry before Honorable Robert M. Dow, Jr: Pursuant to Memorandum Opinion and Order, dated 9/3/2010, the Court grants Plaintiffs motion for partial summary judgment [28] on its Commerce Clause claim. However, the Court denies Plaintiffs request to remedy the unconstitutionality of Illinois system by extending the self–distribution privilege to out–of–state brewers. That remedy would be more disruptive to the existing statutory and regulatory scheme than the alternative remedy of withdrawing the self–distribution privilege from in–state brewers. Finally, in recognition of the General Assemblys ultimate authority over Illinois public policy, including a remedy for the constitutional defect identified in this legislation, the Court stays the enforcement of its ruling until March 31, 2011, in order to provide the General Assembly with sufficient time to act on this matter. The parties are directed to file a joint status report by March 15, 2011, advising the Court of the status of any legislative efforts to address the constitutional defect identified in this opinion, after which time the Court will determine whether to lift or extend the stay. See *Action Wholesale Liquors*, 463 F. Supp. 2d at 1307–08 (employing similar procedure). Mailed notice(tbk,)
